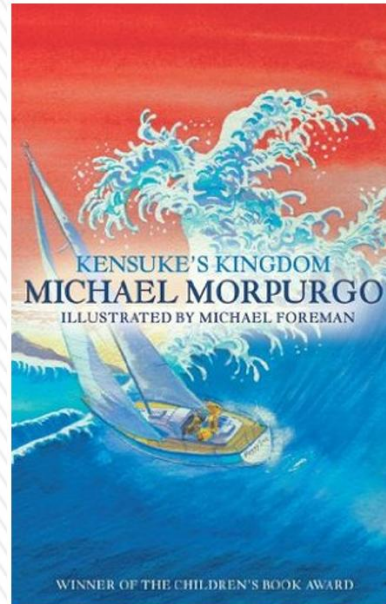
Year 5 so far.....

- » They are getting used to the new timetable and the work rate!

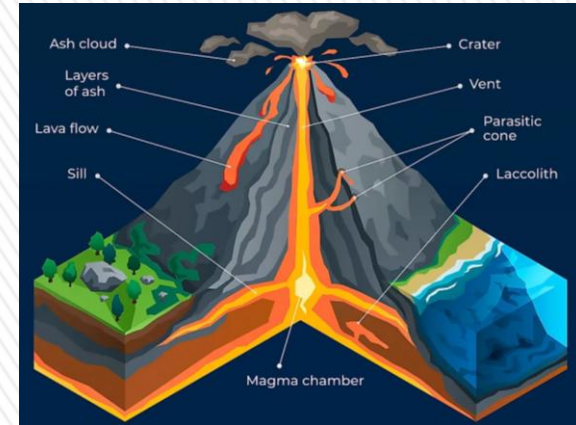

RE: What does it mean to live a good life?

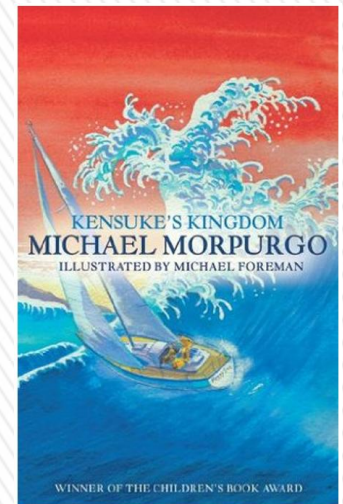

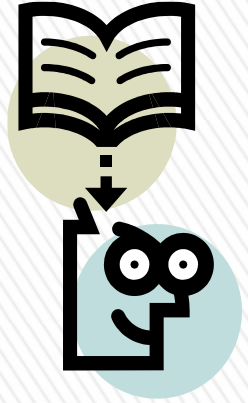

Assessments

Assessment Expectations for an average child:



PiXL Grades	Definition
A1	Based on current rate of progress, will secure Greater Depth Standard (GDS)
A2	Based on current rate of progress, will securely achieve Age Related Expectations (ARE). With the right support, has the potential to achieve Greater Depth Standard (GDS)
E1	Based on current rate of progress, will secure Age Related Expectations (ARE)
E2	Based on current rate of progress is likely to achieve Age Related Expectations (ARE) but may require some additional support
B1	Based on current rate of progress, will not achieve Age Related Expectations (ARE) but with the right support, has the potential to do so
B2	Working Towards the Age Related Expectations (ARE)



Home learning and how you can help...

- Reading Records
- Maths – in line with weekly objectives. These will be set on White Rose Infinity.
- Spelling rules will be sent home weekly via Spelling Shed. The lists will be live from Friday after a spelling lesson and the children will be tested the following Friday.
- Times tables – encourage your children to go on TTRS and work on times tables, in Year 5 the children really do need to know up to 12 so they can re-call these quickly.
