Before you press play...

- ✓ Make sure that the lesson plays on your device.
- ✓ If you are delivering remotely, ensure the video plays correctly through the screen share function.
- ✓ If it is not possible for students to take part in discussions, ask them to write down their thoughts instead, or discuss with their Parent/Carer at home.
- ✓ Ask students to have a pen and paper to hand.

Description

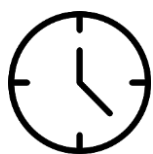
'The Internet Owl: Be Kind Online' takes place in The Internet Jungle. There's Toby Tiger, Marshall Monkey, Cecilia Crocodile and Helena Hippo, and all of the animals are watched over by The Internet Owl.

Toby Tiger is feeling upset because the other animals left an unkind comment on his picture. As the story progresses, your students will go on a journey with the Internet Owl, and help him to teach the animals how to be kind online.

There will be points in the video where you will press pause, and the students will take part in interactive activities or discussions.

This lesson is delivered by Laura Lattimore and James Ward, Co-Founders of OpenView Education. Featured in the video you will also meet OpenView Education's signature puppets, Milly and Philip. There are animations of the Internet Jungle and the animals to help your students really engage with the story.

Running Time:



Video Running Time: **15 minutes**

Lesson duration including activities: **45 - 60 minutes**

Learning Outcomes:

- 🎯 I can talk about how anyone experiencing bullying can get help.
- 🎯 I can describe how to behave online in ways that do not upset others and can give examples.
- 🎯 I can describe ways that some people can be unkind online. I can offer examples of how this can make others feel.

At 3:57 Press Pause.

Questions on Screen:

'What did Toby Tiger's friends do that was unkind?'

'How might this make Toby Tiger feel?'

Students discuss in pairs or small groups, then share their ideas.

At 4:38 Students Stand Up

Follow James as he leads students in an interactive movement sequence, flying through the Internet Jungle with the Internet Owl.

At 6:28 Students sit down

At 8:12 Press Pause

Questions on Screen:

'What could Marshall Monkey do to be kind online?'

'Think of two things that Marshall Monkey could do to be kind online.'

Students discuss in pairs or small groups then share their ideas.

At 10:33 Press Pause

Questions on Screen:

'If you ever see something online that upsets you, who could you talk to?'

'Think of three people you could speak with.'

Students discuss as a class.

At the end of the lesson, students will be reminded what Marshall Monkey, Helena Hippo and Cecilia Crocodile learnt in the story.

What's Next?

Students can create their own 'Be Kind Online' Poster.

On their poster they can draw a picture of the animals in the story, and write down their key learning points from the story.
