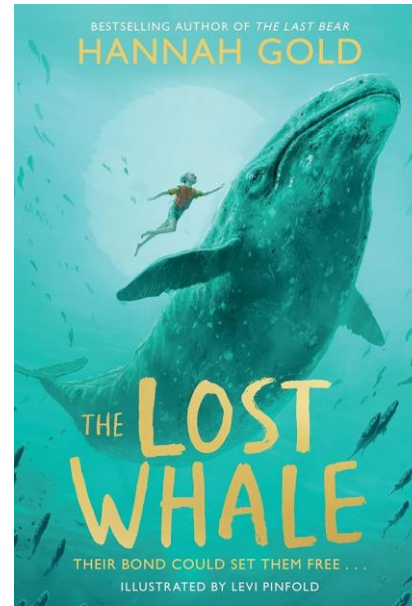

- ▶ Imminent: 11+, buddy pairing and elections, Science sweet sorting

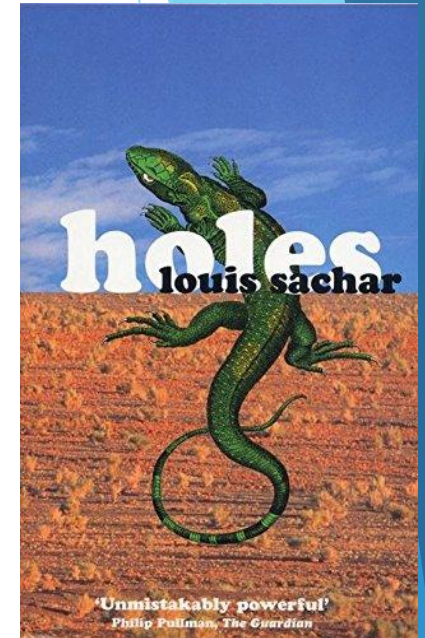

INDEPENDENCE

Organisation

- ▶ Children in for 8:40 morning work
- ▶ Uniform (including shoes) and PE kit named
- ▶ Pencil cases: blue handwriting pen, pencil, ruler, rubber, sharpener, glue stick, colouring pencils (traffic light), purple pen and a whiteboard pen
- ▶ Reading record/homework diary to be checked weekly but brought into school daily
- ▶ Pupils should be reading daily
- ▶ All pupils to have a reading book in school (can be from home or school)
- ▶ Games Day: Tuesday
- ▶ PE Days: 6E - Fridays. 6P & 6PS - Thursdays

Uniform

Winter:

- White short-sleeved polo shirt (polo shirt with school logo is optional)
- Navy sweatshirt or cardigan with school logo
- Dark grey school trousers or shorts
- Dark grey skirt (knee length)
- Smart black shoes
- Dark grey socks or tights
- Reception and KS1 children may wear a dark grey tunic with a plain white polo shirt
- Reception and KS1 children must have a Great Missenden School bookbag
- KS2 children may bring an appropriate bag of their choice
- Coats should be warm and waterproof.

Summer

- As above
- Blue gingham summer dress (worn with white socks)

PE kit

- Dark / light blue sports polo with school logo
- Navy shorts or skirt
- Navy / light blue sports socks
- Navy tracksuit may be worn for outdoor sports in winter (logo optional)
- Indoor PE is performed in bare feet
- Trainers for outdoor PE and games

Uniform continued

Shoulder length hair needs to be tied back with a blue or black bobble/hairband.

Piercings need to be studded and removed for PE/Games or taped if recently pierced.

If your child arrives at school in clothes that do not align with our policy, don't fret! Each year group will have a spare supply of plimsolls, as well as school jumpers, cardigans, polos, trousers and shorts which they will borrow for the day and return before heading home.

As the oldest children in the school, your children will be expected to set the standard for the rest of the school.

Home learning and how you can help...

- This half term our focus for home learning will be reading, spelling and times tables. Maths, SPAG home learning and optional home learning projects will be introduced after half term. Please read with your children / hear them read and discuss what has been read.
- Spellings will be sent home weekly. Children will be tested the following week. Spelling lists are also available on Spelling Shed. *Spellings will be tested on a Friday and start next week.*
- Reading records/homework diaries to encourage independence (not used for communication)

11+ proper - Thursday 11th September

We are just a test centre; we do not teach the 11+ as part of the school curriculum.

All children are automatically enrolled. If you do not want your child to take part, you must email office@gmglt.co.uk and copy in year6@gmglt.co.uk as it is imminent.

Children must sit the practice test before the real thing.

We will talk to the children with Mr Magee this week to discuss arrangements, as well as calming nerves, worries and anxieties that the children have.

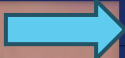

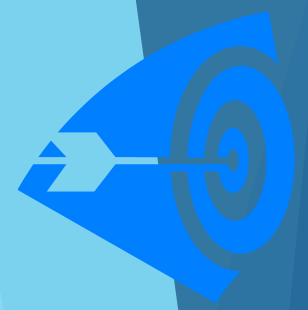
